

# 16 to 19 Tuition Fund 2023-2024 Academic Year

## Statement on How We Intend to Use the Fund to Support Disadvantaged Students

The 16 to 19 Tuition Fund was first provided for the 2020 to 2021 academic year and has been extended to the 2023 to 2024 academic year.

It is available to provide supplementary tutoring for students who fit in to the following categories:

- have achieved a grade 5 or below in English and/or Maths
- come from an economically disadvantaged part of the city and would benefit from catch-up support (these are defined as students from the 27% most economically deprived post-codes of the country based on the Index of Multiple Deprivation)
- students who were previously in receipt of pupil premium funding or are currently receiving free school meals or bursary support

All supported students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme and have had their learning disrupted by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

We will have particular regard for the needs of students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), especially where these students experienced additional disruption.

### Amount for Post 16 Tutoring Provision

St Mary Redcliffe and Temple School is eligible to receive £17,817 from this fund for individual or small group tuition. We have no money carried over from 2022-23.

### **Target Groups**

- Y13 GCSE Maths retake students who have already sat the exams during Y12 and not improved their grade
- Disadvantaged students identified with challenges and gaps due to extended school closure

### How Will The 2023/24 Fund Be Directed?

### GCSE Maths retake students in Year 13 (grade 3 or below)

We will use a tutor to provide additional paired tuition towards the GCSE resit in November and/or Summer 2024

### Targeted support for disadvantaged students & SEND

We will use a combination of current and previous teachers known to the school and tutoring companies to provide a mix of small group and 1-2-1 tuition for a range of subjects across our A Level provision to be determined once the final cohort is known and depending on their areas of need.
