

The Second Half of Y12




BROMCOM and **MCAS**

- As part of the ongoing effort to improve the information and communication the school provides, the school has changed our management information system (MIS).
- This new system is called **Bromcom**.
- Instead of using Edulink, Bromcom's parent app is MyChildAtSchool (MCAS) and the student app is Student Portal.

KEY ACADEMIC REMINDERS

- Students should be planning their time at the beginning of each week.
- Students should be spending an hour for an hour on their studies.
- Remember the biggest difference between GCSE and A Level is the amount of time students are expected to work outside of lessons.
- Some of this time will be spent completing homeworks, but the rest of the time will be spent revisiting and growing in confidence with previous topics.
- We have spent lots of time in ViP lessons talking through the expectations and building the study skills needed. We will continue to do this and remember there is lots of advice on the study skills website (accessible via the 6th form tab of the school website).





EXTENSION STUDIES / EXTENDED PROJECT

- All students not doing Maths Studies have followed our Extension Studies course so far building thinking and research skills and wider social/political awareness.
- This provides a foundation for completing an Extended Project.
- The EPQ is an independent research project (typically a 5000 word essay) on a topic of a student's choosing which gains a qualification worth half an A Level and builds important skills
- It is not compulsory and students can replace the lessons with an equivalent (2 hours per fortnight) time commitment of inclass support for younger students, volunteering or workexperience through the rest of Y12 and Y13, or super-curricular study.





Y12 MOCK EXAMS

- Mocks are the week before the May half term and the first week after (20th - 24th May and Monday 3rd June- Friday 7th June 2024)
- Students will be off timetable during these two weeks in order to give them an as real as possible experience of exams ready for next year and give them time to revise.
- Students who need more structure than this though will have a programme of library lessons.
- The results in these exams will help teachers decide on predicted grades for the gradesheet at the end of Y12, plus will help inform UCAS Predicted Grades.
- There is no expectation for any student to sit an external exam (AS) in the summer of 2024. Some have decided to do this.





AFTER EXAMS- STUDENTS RETURN ON MONDAY 10TH JUNE

- Y12 lessons re-start on Monday 10th June.
- You will receive a grade-sheet with summer mock results, updated predicted and effort grades on **in July**.
- Activities Week is Week of 8th July (Trips for some but Work Experience for most).
- Last day before summer holidays- Tuesday 23rd July
- A Level Results day is Thursday 15th August (GCSE results are on the 22nd). This is just for students who sat AS exams. Results will be released at 9.00am both onsite and online via Bromcom.





UCAS PREDICTED GRADES

- We adopt a consistent and evidence-based approach to UCAS predicted grades, which ensures that predictions are both aspirational and achievable and a true reflection of the student's ability and potential.
- UCAS predicted grades will be based upon the student's performance during Year 12 and into Year 13 and teachers will consider all of the following factors when making their decisions:
 - Assessment results throughout the school year(s)
 - End of Year 12 mock exam results
 - Performance on homework assignments and tests
 - Student's engagement and behaviour levels
 - Practical evidence or other non-examined elements




How can I help?
