- There are over **50,000 undergraduate** courses in the UK so it is vital that you do your research
- Use the **UCAS search tool** e.g –

Law – 1517 courses from 144 providersPsychology – 1746 courses from 161 providers

- Even if you are not sure if you want to go to university, apply through UCAS to give yourself more opportunities
- You can make up to **5 choices**. You can apply for more than one course at the same institution



What type of course?





Single Honours

One main subject, with optional modules throughout each year.



Joint or Combined Honours

Studying two subjects, which are split 50:50 throughout your degree, giving you a broader knowledge of two different areas.



Year Abroad or Year in Industry

An opportunity to gain real-world experience, making you an attractive candidate for jobs after graduating.



Integrated Masters

A four-year degree that extends your studies to Master's level.




Foundation Year

How much work is involved in gaining a degree?




This depends entirely on the subject that you're studying but not all of your time will be taken up by lectures, seminars, etc

What is UCAS?



UCAS is the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service. They are the organisation responsible for processing applications to UK universities for undergraduate courses. It is a resource for parents, advisers, teachers as well as students.

You use UCAS to:



How do you apply?



- All of your application is done online via the UCAS website.
- You will need to register with UCAS at <u>www.ucas.com</u> and your application is on your UCAS Hub Dashboard
- Select 'Sign In' and then 'Register'
- To start an undergraduate application, select the year you want to start your studies
- usually 2025 ENTRY and select 'Undergraduate'



UCAS Hub lets you organise everything including your application – in one place. Explore your options, favoriting subjects, and using the handy tools.

- 1. Explore tool search for subjects and courses.
- 2. Notepad So you can keep all thoughts together.
- 3. Apprenticeship finder vacancies, locally and nationally
- 4. Personal Statement Builder helps you structure your writing and introduce yourself.
- 5. Tariff Calculator tally up your UCAS points to see what requirements you meet.


