	Weekly homework are set at the beginning of the unit where students are given a choice of activities they can complete. They prepare a short presentation for the end of the unit of their homework.	Homework are assessed by the teacher towards the end of the unit in a specific lesson. Students are to bring in the terms' homework for this lesson. Teachers may ask to see any homework before that date to check progress.

	A relevant mid-term assessment will be marked by the teacher, and targets will be set to help the student in the final termly assessment. Discussions, questioning and presentations will be used by teachers to assess progress throughout in class.	Formative comments will be seen in the small exercise book next to the mid term assessment ( <i>What Went Well</i> and <i>Even Better If</i> ) and next to the final assessment in the larger 'best book'.

Any other information Assessments are conducted in a 'best book' which is kept in school but parents may wish to see it if requested. The final assessment is conducted under exam conditions with a time limit of 30 minutes with minimal help (plus extra time if needed). Support and scaffolding is given in the preceding lessons to students, not in the assessment itself, unless the teacher makes an exception for a specific student. All assessments are unseen and all students complete the same assessment.
