Pupils consider why there is a difference in practice and why these issues have led to a diversity of opinion and debate within Christianity.

Pupils consider the impact of crime on an societal level, considering the interdependence of our society.

They will be able to review and be organised in their revision ahead of the end of unit assessment.

We are organised	Issues of Life and Death topic considers religious and non-religious views on topics such as evolution, abortion, euthanasia and life after death.	Pupils reflect on the differences between religious and non-religious perspectives on the sensitive issues discussed and communicate their own responses. Pupils will be taught about how to respond to the only question that specifically refers to non-religious perspectives so this will help organisation ahead of the exam.
