Examinations

There are two 1-hour exams (1 Hour for Christianity: Beliefs and Christianity Practices, 1 hour for Islam: Beliefs and Islam: Practices)

There is one 2-hour exam on the Philosophical and Ethical Issues, with reference to religious views).

All the sections in all three papers follow the same question formats (1 x 2-mark question, 1 x 5 mark question, 1 x 8 mark question and 1 x 15 mark question
