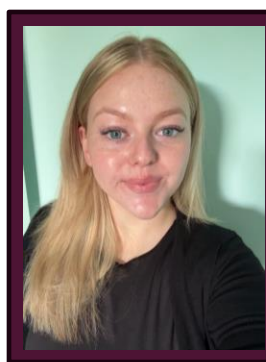

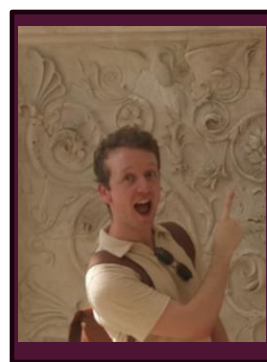

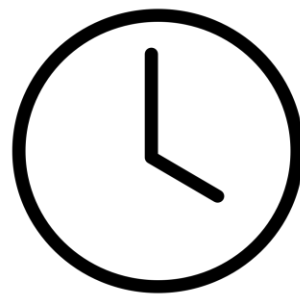

Frees!!!

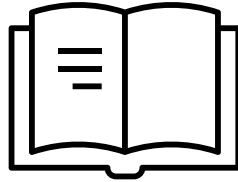
This is when a lesson isn't timetabled, but you are expected to be completing homework, revising or wider reading.



How to SMASH your A-Levels!!

- **Equipment:** You'll need notebooks and folders for your subjects. We recommend paper that you can easily rip out and file in folders
- **Organisation:** Start organising your folders from the start of the year to make sure it doesn't pile up! A good plan is to organise them at the end of each week
- **Free Periods:** Use frees to your advantage to save time by getting work done in the library or free rooms. This allows you to have more time after school and on weekends!
- **Subjects:** You can start on 4 subjects and if the workload becomes too much drop to 3 and then you can utilise the extra frees for revision.
- **Support:** Always feel free to speak to teachers, subject mentors and senior students if you need anything you can find this information display boards around the building!
- **Opportunities:** There will be an enrichment fair at the start of the year of societies, we highly recommend joining any you find interesting! Throughout the year try go on Uni open days and careers fairs!

Study Tips



Make your flashcards as you go along

Talk to the subject mentors they are here to help!

Listen to white noise/ study music

Start revising from the start of the year it will pay off!

Do your hour for an hour!

Start teaching your subject to friends or family to deepen your understanding

If your subject has proof of study make sure to do it!

Have spaced periods of studying and rest – try the Pomodoro technique

Find a space to study where you can concentrate

Minimize distractions – putting your phone away can be so useful



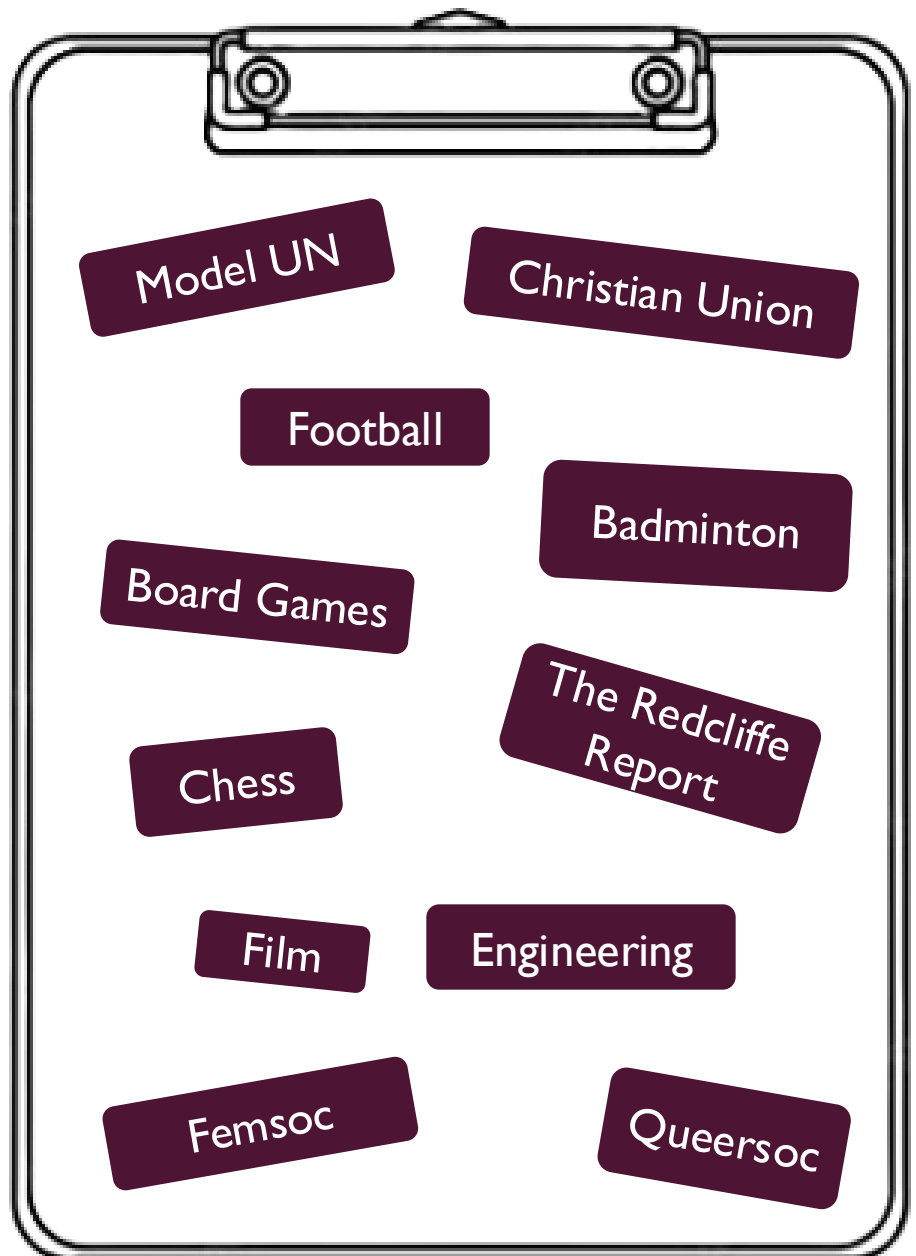
Societies and Clubs

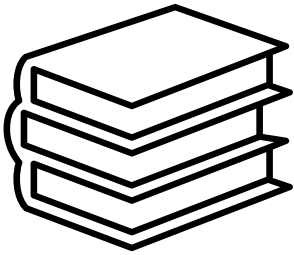

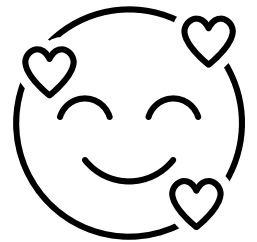

Where can I find my teachers?

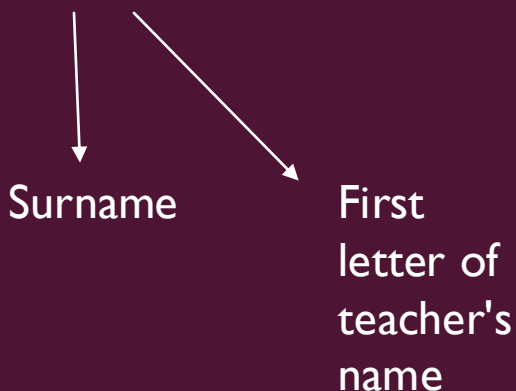
You can usually find teachers in their subject staff rooms on each floor, in main school or in the Head of Year office. Some teachers have specific offices:

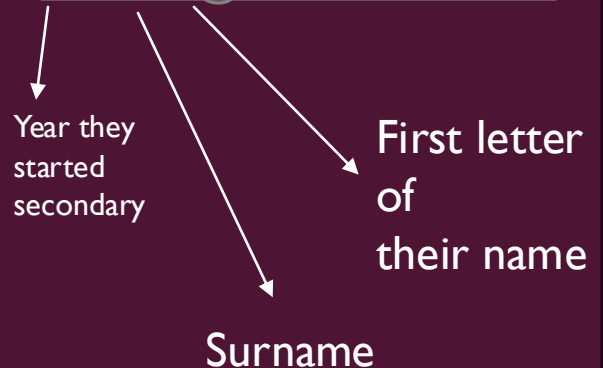

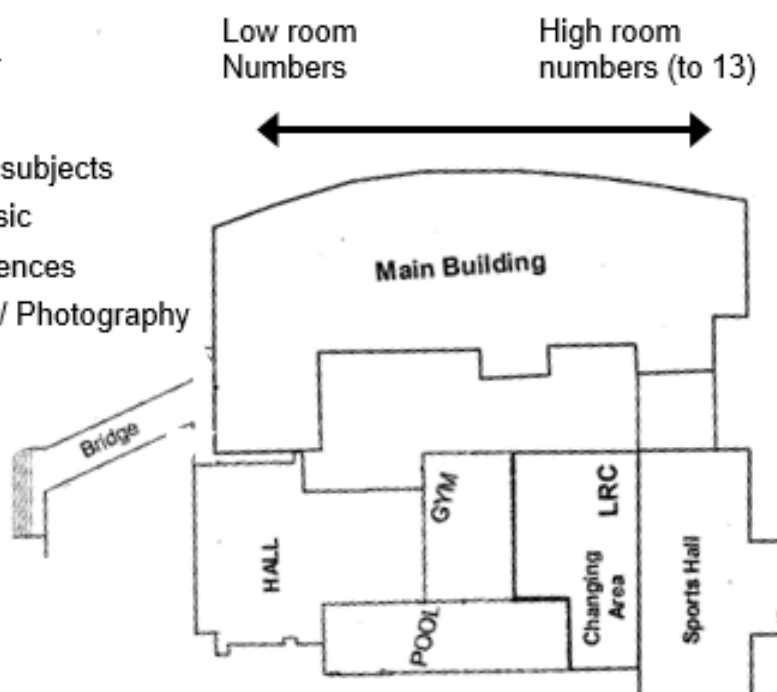


Map

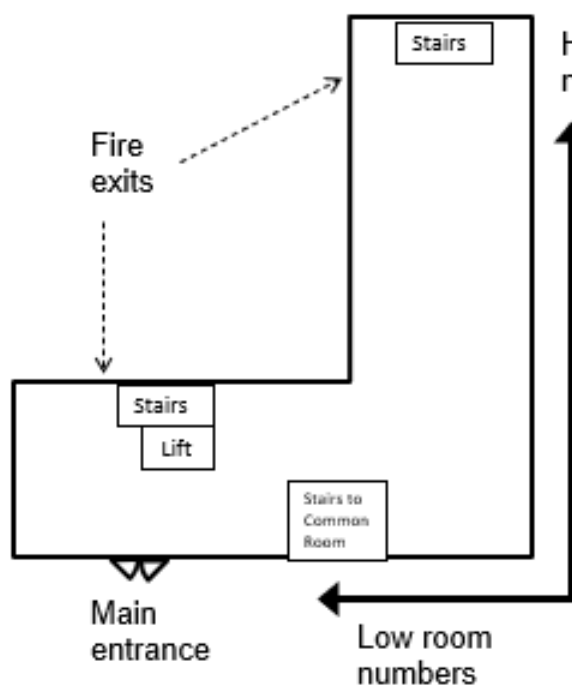
Finding your way around St Mary Redcliffe

- Floor A (lowest) = DT subjects
 Floor B (bridge level) = Music
 Floor C = Sciences
 Floor D (highest) = Art / Photography
