We have therefore set you a simple task to complete, which you should bring with you to your first lesson. It shouldn't take you too long, but there are more resources suggested that you could look at if you want to get deeper into the subject before you start.

To ensure you are ready to fully access the A Level Syllabus you should attempt these tasks:

1. Complete the Tutor2U online transition course – show evidence (notes and screen shot) of course completion. This is free to access and takes you through key concepts in psychology with activities to complete.
