

From the Headteacher

Dear Parent/Carer

Welcome to our final newsletter of the term. It has been a very enjoyable and successful term. We have had a particular focus on embedding the changes and developments introduced last year. All stakeholders have worked hard, and I hope you can get some form of rest and family time during the half-term break.

Admission to Year 7 (September 2024)

A final reminder that if you are making an application to SMRT for a younger sibling and you are applying with faith criteria, please ensure you have:

- Completed the Local Authority application form Apply for a new year 7 secondary school place (bristol.gov.uk) giving your three preferences of school.
- Completed the school supplementary form <u>St Mary Redcliffe and Temple School Admissions</u> (<u>smrt.bristol.sch.uk</u>) to enable us to apply faith criteria to your application.

Closing date for both forms is midnight on Tuesday, 31 October 2023.

If you do not have a Bristol postcode, you will need to apply to us via your own local authority. There are links for Bath and Northeast Somerset, North Somerset, and South Gloucestershire on the Admissions page.

Admission to Year 12 (September 2024)

Our first Sixth Form opening evening took place on Thursday 19 October, and was very well attended. We were grateful for the support of some of our current students, and our sixth form team and teachers, in making this such a success. We have another on Wednesday 8 November. Due to exceptionally high demand, the bookings for the second event are already full, despite adding an extra talk at 5.30pm.

Details about how to apply are on the Sixth Form page of the school website (Applying to Us). It is important that current SMRT Year 11 students apply using their school email address and the password they have been sent to access the application site, and do not register as a new student to the school. Please make sure that you get your application in by 9am on Monday 11 December as priority is given to on time applicants.

Sixth Form News

We are delighted with how well our Year 12s and Year 13s have settled into the new year.

Our students have already contributed greatly to main school and beyond, with lots speaking at promotional events in the main school, mentoring our Year 11s, leading in main school events including an assembly on Black History Month, and are soon going to be helping Year 7 students with their reading. Last week, Year

12s met their Year 13 subject mentors, who shared tips and advice for each A Level subject. Meanwhile 53 of our students have applied through UCAS as early entry applicants so for applications to Oxbridge and/or for Medical, Dentistry and Veterinary courses. This is our highest ever number of early applicants. Sixth Form students are also proposing charities that we raise money for this year. We usually select two.

Provisional GCSE Exam Results

Last month I said we would provide an update on our GCSE exam outcomes. We have now received the provisional results from the DfE. These results suggest a Progress 8 score of +0.39 which is the highest-level SMRT students have achieved since the introduction of this measure. Similarly, disadvantaged students achieved a Progress 8 score of +0.11 which matches our previous highest achievement for this cohort. We expect the final validated results for GCSE and A Level in late October/early November and we will share these when they are live. I would like to put on record my congratulations to the Class of 2023, their parents/carers, and our staff for their role in this achievement.

Year 11 Mock Exams

Year 11 have their mock exams from Monday 6 November to Friday 16 November. Timetables have been sent home and personalised timetables will soon be available via Edulink. Year 11 students have had an assembly on the arrangements for the mock exams, as well as guidance on following exam procedure. Revision topic lists have also been sent out to students and parents and carers. It is important that students revise for these exams as they are excellent preparation for the summer external exams and will help with predicted grades and, for some subjects, tiers of entry.

Attendance and Punctuality

I would like to thank our students, parents, and carers for their contribution in the continued improvement in attendance and punctuality. Our attendance figures for the year so far are higher than this time last year, higher than the Bristol average, and higher than the national average. We are particularly pleased with the improved attend for Year 10 and Year 11 students. Please follow this link for information on our approach to attendance.

We have also seen a significant improvement in student punctuality. We are mindful of the challenges posed by our central location and public transport and therefore it is commendable that we have seen such improved punctuality. With the introduction of our new pastoral curriculum it is vital that students are in school for tutor time. Behaviour and Good Relationships

It has been great hearing visitors and stakeholders commenting on the calm and purposeful feel around the school. We have focused on ensuring that we recognise positive learning and contributions with ALIVE points and I am pleased that all students who have achieved 50 ALIVE points will be receiving a letter of encouragement sent to their parents/carers. These students will also receive a tutor treat from their Head of Year. Extra-Curricular Sport

Well done to all the students who have been able to attend clubs throughout this term. We are pleased that attendance to these clubs has increased over the term. Activities will change after half term with basketball, sports hall athletics, and cross-country competitions taking place in Term 2. Netball

It has been a fantastic start to the Netball season with over 100 students taking part over 3 days. Training has been going very well with a great atmosphere with students working hard to improve their skills and game play. The competitive season began with the Year 11s winning the Central Netball Festival.

Our next round of matches was against Ashton Park with wins for the Year 9 and 10 teams, and a narrow loss for the Year 11 team. The Year 10s played in the Central Netball Festival and came away with 2 wins against Trinity School and Fairfield to win the Festival.

Years 7, 8 and 10 all played Fairfield with the Year 10s winning 24-11. Years 7 and 8 lost their matches despite playing very well against strong teams. They demonstrated a lot of resilience and fought hard all the way to the final whistle. The Year 9 team played in the Central Netball Festival against nine teams. The competition was strong, and they played incredibly well to make it to the semi-finals where they lost by one goal.

Both the Year 7 and 8 have their festivals after the half-term along with further matches against other schools. Thank you to all the staff leading these events and netball players who have trained and competed well. We love seeing how you all support and encourage each other.

Curriculum Website

We are making good progress with updates to and restructure of the Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 curriculum webpages. Please follow this link for a closer look. We are now working on bringing Key Stage 5 up to date, although current Key Stage 5 information provides parents, carers, and students with the key information they need.

Free School Meals

We know that the circumstances of many parents and carers change, and if you are not already registered for free school meals and think you may be entitled, please do register. This helps the school as some of our funding is allocated on the percentage of students on free school meals. This helps your family and the wider school community. Even if your child prefers to bring in a packed lunch, you can register for free school meals and have the occasional morning free from the chore of sandwich making! You can apply for free school meals from Year 3 onwards (including Secondary Schools) if you get any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit: if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get. This is also called the 'minimum income floor'.)
 If your child is eligible for free school meals, they will eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they are in on 31 March 2025.
