1. Introduction

This Policy sets out our arrangements for managing the access of education and training providers to students at our School for the purpose of informing them about approved technical education qualifications, apprenticeships, and other pathways.

It complies with our School's legal obligations under Section 42B of the [Education Act 1997](#) (as amended by the Skills and Post-16 Education Act 2022).

2. Student Entitlement

All students in Years 8–13 are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships as part of a careers programme that provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships, through events such as assemblies, careers fairs, group discussions, and taster sessions.
- Understand how to make applications for academic and technical courses, including apprenticeships and vocational pathways.

5. Provider Access Legislation (PAL) Compliance

In line with PAL, the School will ensure that:

- Students receive at least six provider encounters during Years 8–13.
- Encounters are spread across Key Stages 3, 4, and 5 (a minimum of two per phase).
- Access is fair, transparent, and recorded as part of our CEIAG programme.

6. Premises and Facilities

We will make available appropriate rooms (e.g. hall, classrooms, meeting rooms) and specialist equipment (AV/ICT) to support provider presentations. Arrangements will be agreed in advance with the relevant Progression Coordinator. Providers are welcome to leave copies of prospectuses, course literature, or other relevant materials with the Progression Coordinator, and they will ensure that these materials are made accessible to all students.
