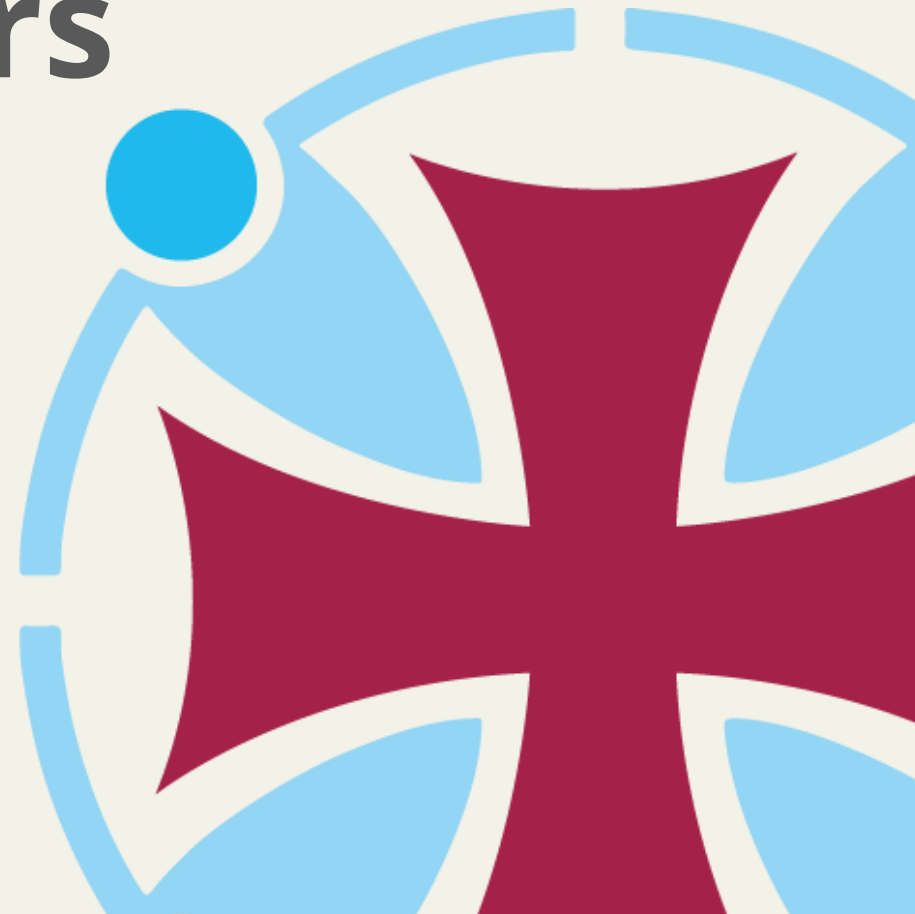

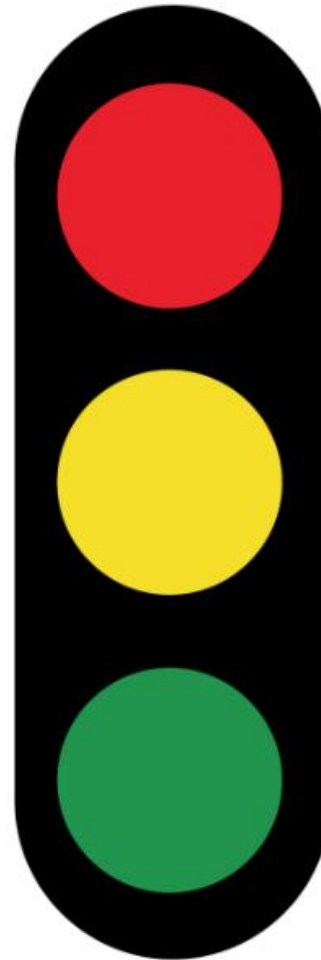

Induction Day Information

- Induction Days: **Wednesday 1 July and Thursday 2 July 2026**
- **Arrival from 8:00am onwards, to start at 8:20am in the Main Hall**
- Make sure you know which day your child is due to be here
- There will be a range of activities (including PE – they will need trainers) and people to meet. Please wear your primary school uniform
- The day finishes early; collection is at **14:45pm**
- Please do not use the carparks at school, you are likely to be blocked in or cause congestion

Students all receive music lessons for two hours per fortnight based around musical analysis and composition, and including basic keyboard skills tuition

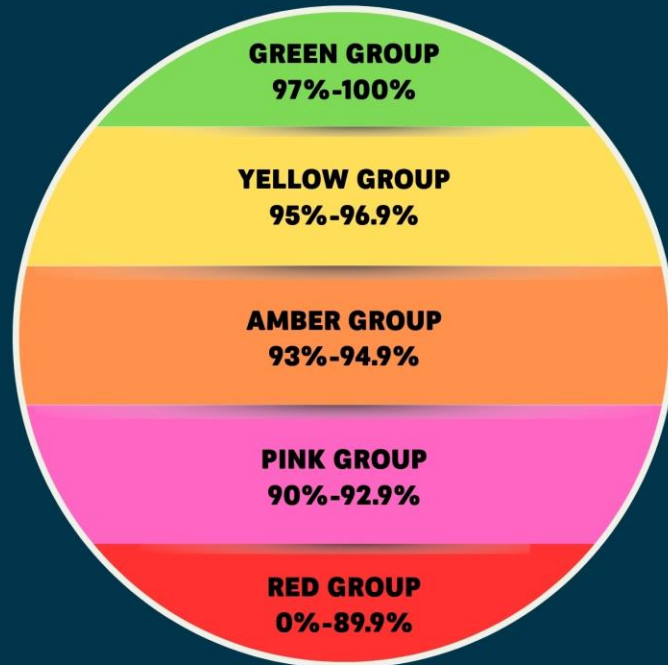

School Uniform

School jumper - 'Redcliffe Red' School jumper. Sleeved or sleeveless (compulsory, bought from Monkhouse)

School 'House' tie - worn as in the picture, up to the collar with the knot visible above the V of the jumper (compulsory, bought from Monkhouse)

Charcoal/grey trousers or grey pleated skirt - to be worn appropriately and not to be tight fitting; skirts to be an appropriate length (available from Monkhouse or high street retailers)

Plain white shirt or blouse, button to neck with collar suitable for wearing with a tie and either long or short sleeves (compulsory)

Black, polishable footwear with no coloured logos (compulsory)

Plain black tights or black/dark coloured ankle-length socks (compulsory)

Black school blazer with SMRT logo (optional item, available from Monkhouse)

Tailored grey 'bermuda' shorts (optional item)

Coat (not compulsory but strongly advised)

Students may wear one pair of studded earrings and a wristwatch. No other piercings/jewellery, including facial piercings, are permitted for safety reasons. Students may wear nail varnish. False nails/acrylics are not permitted for safety reasons. Make-up should be natural and not excessive.

Safeguarding

We 'Value Ourselves' through strong safeguarding of ourselves and others. We have strong safeguards in place to protect all students.

For example:

- A secure site
- Texts home if a student does not arrive in school without an explanation.
- Ensuring that every member of staff is trained and is safe to work with young people.
- Safeguarding and risk assessments for off-site visits.
- Ensuring that there are filters on our internet that restrict harmful or inappropriate material.
- We also have designated safeguarding members of staff who have a role to keep students safe, to make sure students are listened to and supported by the right people.

How to Report Bullying, Discrimination and Harassment

There are three ways to report bullying, discrimination, and harassment.

1.

Verbally (by mouth)



- Speak to your **Tutor** who will listen, support, follow up on and make sure the right people support you.
- You can also speak to your **Head of Year** or **Deputy Head of Year** or Year Group **Learning Mentor**.
- A further group of staff you can report concerns to are our **Behaviour Managers** based on C Floor. They can take the information and make sure your tutor or Year team leaders check in with you to listen and help solve the concern.

Physically (school letter box)



- You can write or type a note and post it in the letter boxes located in each year group office and in visitor reception.
- Please include your **name** if it is about you or the **name of the person** whose safety/wellbeing you are concerned about.
- The boxes will be checked **daily** by Heads of Year and the Administrator for Safeguarding and Mental Health (from 09/23) who will make sure you receive the support you need.

If students have any worries or concerns for themselves or other people they need to speak to a trusted adult, for example: Tutor, Learning Mentor, Deputy Head of Year or their Head of Year.

Students also have access to the Behaviour Support Team to report any concerns or worries they may have.

Smartphones Policy:

Our rules for our context

- We recognise that students need phones for safe travel to and from school
- Students must make sure their phones are not 'used, seen or heard' during the day. They must not have access to their devices. This also applies to headphones and smartwatches.
- On arrival phones must be put away. Once in school, students are expected to put their phones in lockers. If students choose not to do this, they must ensure their phones are off, in their bags and not accessed for the day.
- If 'used, seen or heard' phones will not be returned to the student for 5 days, although parents and carers can collect them earlier (within 8.30-4pm, 3.30pm on Fridays)
- Full details of our approach can be found on our website (policy and letters).

Social Media:

Guidance for Parents and Carers

- Most forms of social media are not recommended for Year 7 students.
- Parents/carers must be responsible for ensuring access to social media is safe and age-appropriate.
- The Government has reviewed social media access for under 16s, changes are expected to come into place early next year.
- If students are using social media (e.g. WhatsApp groups) you **MUST** monitor carefully
- Any posting or accounts relating to the school (e.g. TikTok) are not acceptable
- Online Safety and Acceptable Use Policy.

Free School Meals

You may be eligible if you receive any of the following, please make sure you reapply for September using this [link](#). From September, the Government has changed the criteria for who is able to access Free School Meals. If you have been rejected in the past, you can reapply.

- Households on Universal Credit, earning more than £7,400 per year
- Households on Income Support or Employment Support Allowance
- Households on Universal Credit earning less than £7,400 per year also attract Pupil Premium funding in addition to FSM
